2. Steve will prepare an invoice which can be used for membership renewal.

3. The 2020 Contract for Gonzales Center is \$1,080.25. Linda moved to pay contract and deposit in full. Jim seconded it

4. Raffles: Steve said that the orchid society should be in charge of the Garden Festival raffles and take in the money. Then the society can reimburse the Garden Festival Account with the Inland Empire Master Gardeners Club.

4. Auction: Tom will send letters to all of the vendors.


5. Jim has found software for the auction and he will set it up.

Membership Dues are Due January 1, 2020. The dues are \$25 per household per year.


Our society will be able to accept credit card payments at the February meeting for membership. This will also be available at our Orchid Auction.
