## MORONGO BASIN ORCHID FESTIVAL AOS ORCHID SHOW

Our orchid society hosted the AOS orchid show at the Morongo Basin Festival which was sponsored and staged by Gubler's Orchids in Landers, CA.

We wish to thank all our members for their support, either by entering orchids, helping put up and tear down the show, judging the designs, creating the designs (both large and small), hosting the show, helping with the two floral design classes, transporting orchids to the show and for those unable to be with us in person, we thank you for your encouragement and thoughts.

We wish to congratulate Dann Dunst for his Best of Show Orchid entry and Rozie Trammell for her Best of Show Floral Design entry. Several orchids were considered for AOS awards and finally five orchids were awarded AOS awards after hours of deliberation. We want to thank the three AOS judges for their time and dedication. A special thanks to Fred Clarke of Sunset Valley Orchids for his entries of first blooming seedlings. They were a hit, especially when we explained to the guests the uniqueness of these particular plants. A special thanks to Karl and Miki Batchman of Casa de las Orquideas for their Cymbidium that is blooming out of season. We were able to bring a lot of people into conversation because of this entry. Entries from our members and workers at Gubler's also gave us talking points and the entries were constantly being photographed by the guests.

The two orchid design classes were well attended. It took four of us to keep the classes going as they were hands on designs with orchid plants and a foliage plant in a container. Gubler's Orchids supplied the plants and the containers for the classes.

We had a total of 36 Orchid plant entries, 5 flora arrangements and 4 mini flora arrangements. For the floral orchid arrangement class, we had 47 attendees that paid \$30 each. This event is an important fund raiser for our society. What a fun way to raise money for our projects.

A special "Shout Out" to Kelsey Gubler, who was responsible for the organization and running of the festival. The festival went without a hitch as far as we were concerned. We had full support from Kelsey and Chris Gubler for the expenses incurred for the show, and orchid plants and flowers for the designs, as well as hosting the AOS judges.

The three AOS judges spent many hours examining the orchids which they had chosen to consider for AOS awards. They also took time from their busy schedule to ribbon judge the orchid entries in the show. That was a big help to our society.

The members of our society who helped in so many ways to make this show a success from setting up, tearing down, creating designs, transporting plants, entering, assisting with the classes, hosting the show and supporting us from afar.

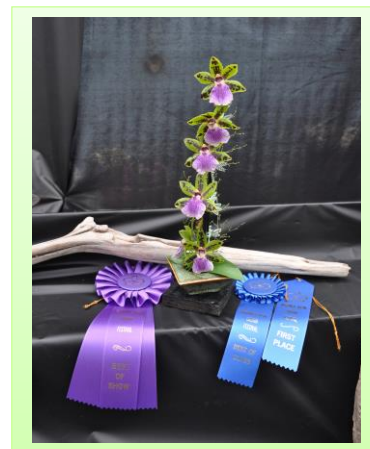

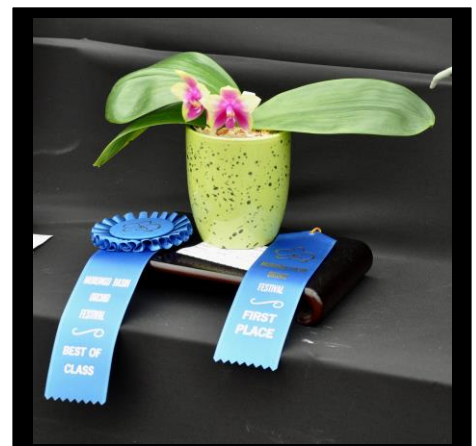
## Our Centennial Celebration at the Historic Biltmore Hotel - POSTPONED
