Garden Festival and Flower Show:

Entries will be accepted Friday March 3, 2023 from 5 pm – 6:30 pm and Saturday March 4, 2023 from 7 am – 9 am. We will need workers for both days. We need your blooming orchid plants as well as other horticulture specimens and floral designs. Riverside Flower Show:

More information will be coming. We will be judging Orchids, have a table to promote our society and we will be a vendor selling orchid plants. Dates are April 29th and 30th.

Catasetinae Growing Tips:

Note that we had some of these on last month's plant table. We have a two more for February plant table. Come and buy raffle tickets, good luck.

Catasetum, Clowesia, Cycnoches and Mormodes are seasonal growers. New pseudobulbs develop and mature in a six-to-seven-month period. When mature it flowers and then the leaves drop off and the Orchid plant will rest for one to four months before the cycle starts again. While growing, these orchids should be watered heavily and maintain high humidity. Use a balanced fertilizer during the growing season.

The leaves yellowing and dropping off signal the beginning of dormancy. You should now stop fertilizing and cut back on watering frequency, this simulates the end of the wet season in nature. This will cause the pseudobulbs to harden off in preparation for the upcoming months of dormancy. When most leaves are yellow/brown and have fallen off, stop watering altogether. This is the start of the dormant period.

Some Orchids in this group begin their flowering season at the end of the growing season and the onset of leaf yellowing and in dormancy. Some plants don't even start to develop inflorescence until well after all water is stopped and the plant is leafless. If your orchid pseudobulb starts to shrivel up you can water a couple of times to plum it back up. But, not all of these orchids will lose their green leaves when dormant. Some will hold a few leaves past the point when irrigation has stopped. Some plants will resist dormancy if grown indoors. To help trigger dormancy in these Orchids let the media stay dry for 4 – 5 days then water sparingly with about one or two ounces of water. Allow the media to dry and wait 5-6 days before following the same stingy watering procedure. Repeat this process, increasing the dry intervals between waterings.

If you have problems with excessive dehydration caused by long periods of low humidity, here is a solution. Set the pot in a clean jar with water, then set the pot into the jar.

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The water should not touch the bottom of the pot, preferably 2-3 inches away. The water in the jar will maintain high humidity around the roots, while the plant remains dry during dormancy. Another approach is to increase the humidity by spraying with a water mist. See pictures below.

Use sphagnum in clay pots, medium fine fir bark in clay or plastic pots, or mounted with sphagnum at the roots on tree fern, cork, driftwood or in baskets. Mormodes show a preference in nature to dead or rotting wood, so use this if available. Suspending or hanging the plants help provide good air circulation.



The board meetings are held on the fourth Sunday of the month and the general society membership is always welcome. If you are a board member and you are not able to attend, please notify Tom Gibbs


